Why Race - Why Now?

Linda Cavaioli, Executive Director of the YWCA of Central Massachusetts will be our guest speaker. The mission of the YWCA is eliminating racism and empowering women. The YWCA seeks to go beyond changing hearts and minds to transforming communities, systems, and public policy through the programs and services that it offers. Each year, 76 percent of women and children served by the YWCAs nationally have incomes below the federal poverty level or less.

Briefly with Bev

Another year is upon us! Welcome, welcome back! I hope your summer was restful, productive, fun, safe, and all that you hoped it would be.

A few months ago, I started a daily practice of reading a meditation from Open Mind: Women's Daily Inspiration for Becoming Mindful by Diane Mariechild. As I sat to write this column the reading for the day said,

*"You need companions to travel
To the Isle of the Immortals –
It is hard to climb
The azure cliffs alone.
If you take dead stillness for refinement,
The weak water brimming
Will lack a convenient boat."*

The author is asserting that we need spiritual companions whatever path we are following – even if it is not to the Isle of Immortals – the legendary abode of the Taoist adepts. At times, we humans fool ourselves and we can become lost in our individual delusions of the ego. Often it is our spiritual community that challenges and supports us when our egos trick us in this way.

One such illusion, according to the author, is "mistaking dead stillness for realization." In this stagnant stage we may appear peaceful but instead are in a state of denial. True stillness is a peaceful state that is also vibrant, receptive, and alive. In Taoist philosophy "weak waters" refers to not being able to hold any weight. So, if we are weighed down by blocked energy, by attachments, by fear, then we are not light enough to cross the water.

The author concludes that the next time your ego bumps up against another you should take a deep breath. Then, instead of immediately speaking or acting, you are asked to reflect on what inside you is causing this conflict.

This is a lesson that many of us need learn over and over again. It is common for our egos to bump into another's because we are tired, or worn down by current circumstances. Too often we accept the status quo, convincing ourselves this is the peace we seek.

So, as we journey into our second year together, I ask this of you. Challenge one another. Support one another. Examine your stillnesses and determine if they are part of a stagnant state of denial or a truly receptive, vibrant state of openness and growth. Together we can cross the water and travel to our version of the Isle of Immortals.

Children and Youth Religious Education Program

Class Groupings and Curricula for 2016-2017

Preschool through Second Grade: “Spirit Play”

Using key elements from Montessori education, the Spirit Play program creates a spiritual community of children and presents the core stories of our Unitarian Universalist faith in ways that support multiple learning styles. In this program, children are encouraged to make meaning through wondering, art, and play.

Third and Fourth Grade: “Faithful Journeys”

What does it mean to live and act as a Unitarian Universalist? What kinds of life choices can our faith help us to make each day? This program, structured around the Unitarian Universalist Principles, guides participants on a journey to discover the many different ways we can act faithfully in our own lives.

Fifth and Sixth Grade: “Harry and UU”

This social action program, based on the Harry Potter series of books by J.K. Rowling, encourages participants to harness their powers of good (and employ some fun wizarding magic!) to fight real world Horcruxes such as poverty, illiteracy, and hunger, through social action projects.

Seventh and Eighth Grade: “Heeding the Call”

Heeding the Call is a social justice curriculum that explores oppressions that marginalize some members of our society, and encourages participants to develop into leaders in acting for social justice. Each themed workshop in this program includes stories, discussion, games, and role-play that provide participants with tools and knowledge they use to work together on a program-long social justice project.

Teaching Team Meeting

Teaching team members for grades PreK through eight will be meeting at 9 am on September 11th. At this meeting, schedules will be determined and CORI forms and Code of Ethics forms will be filled out. (Please bring your calendar and driver’s license.) The curriculum and teaching guide will be handed out and tips and strategies will be discussed.

Religious Education Program Open House

The Religious Education Committee (REC) will be hosting the annual Open House for the RE Program on Sunday, September 18th beginning at 9:30 am. The DRE and members of the REC will be available to answer questions about the program and give tours of the classes. The Open House is a chance for anyone to learn more about the RE program here at UUCSW, including goals, structure, and curricula. If you know of anyone who is curious about our congregation or RE program, then this would be the perfect day for those families to join us.

Sunday Morning Programming for September:

September 11th - This is opening Sunday, and all ages will worship together in the sanctuary for a multigenerational service. Please be sure to register your child/youth and pick up your 2016- 2017 Program Handbook.

September 18th - This is a sanctuary start. Teacher Dedication and RE Open House.

- Preschool-Second Grade: Orientation. Parents and children will be introduced to the Spirit Play program and learn the Gandhi Peace Greeting and the Spirit Play chalice lighting song.
- Third and Fourth Grade: The Journey Begins (part 1). The children will be introduced to the Faithful Journeys program, create their class covenant, and begin thinking about their path for the year.
- Fifth and Sixth Grade: Opening Ceremony. The children will be introduced to the Harry and UU curriculum, work together to create their class rules and their magic wands, and learn about the seven Horcruxes they will be working to fight over the course of the year.
- Seventh and Eighth Grade: The Call for Awareness (part 1). The students will explore the concepts of awareness and justice, and they will be introduced to the Justicemakers Guide.

September 25th - This is a sanctuary start.

- Preschool-Second Grade: Flaming Chalice Basic Lesson. The children will learn about the flaming chalice, explore its meaning, and discuss the promises we make to each other in our Unitarian Universalist community.
- Third and Fourth Grade: The Journey Begins (part 2). The children will think about the seven principles and begin their story path with three stories of faithful action.
- Fifth and Sixth Grade: The Illiteracy Horcrux. The children will work together to plan and promote a book drive in order to fight the Illiteracy Horcrux.
- Seventh and Eighth Grade: The Call for Awareness (part 2). The students will continue to explore the concepts of awareness and justice, and discuss the results of their Faith in Action Activist Interviews.
